

Report to Governors on the Impact of Sport Premium Funding in Relation to Attainment

Last year 49% of children in Year 6 attended either a before, or after school extra curricular sporting club. A large proportion of sport premium money is used to fund the numerous and varied sporting clubs that we offer at South Rise.

Using the data that was submitted on the John Sinnott tracker I have explored in detail the attainment that was achieved in maths, reading and writing from those children who regularly attended a sporting club.

Attainment in Reading
