

Governors report on Sports Provision for Summer Term 2016

Clubs Offered

During the Summer Term 262 children attended a number of before and after school sporting clubs from years 1 to 6. These included four square, dodge ball, basketball and multi skills. Children continued to have professional coaching in cricket, football and rugby.

Additional Costings

Sport premium money was also used to finance the travel to the Kent Cricket finals and the London Cricket finals. In addition sport premium money was used to purchase additional P.E kits for children to use enabling greater participation in lessons. We were able to renew our playground equipment for all children to use in both key stages. Finance also enabled myself to attend P.E. Development programs run through Greenwich.

We also were able to continue to finance our links with Thomas Tallis school and Plumstead Manor School. As a result children from KS1 attended practical games sessions at Plumstead Manor as well as a number of competitive fixtures. Children from KS2 enjoyed attending Kidzfit workshops, dance workshops and multi skills days as well as a number of competitive events at Thomas Tallis.

However, XXXX has expressed an interest in wanting to play four square, a playground game. Having consulted with XXXX's Mum it was suggested that she joined after school four square club .

Abigail was reluctant to take part initially but I spent a degree of time with her explaining the rules whilst we observed the game being played by others. We also spent time together working on the techniques needed to hit the ball and the tactics needed to become what is known as Queen.

It was wonderful to see her gain in confidence and watch her become increasingly confident and cooperative when playing with her peers. Abigail has continued to play four square in year 6 and regularly takes part during play and lunchtimes also. Her confidence and self-esteem have increased and it is a pleasure to watch her enjoying herself and having fun with her friends.
